

2016-17: Numeracy Catch-up Premium

42 students (35% of cohort) have been identified with a score of below 100 in the KS2 Numeracy SATs paper, 14 (33%) of these students were in receipt of the pupil premium grant. These students did not meet the standard in numeracy and have been targeted through the catch up funding.

Numeracy Catch-up Strategy

1. Good teaching and learning every day, in every lesson.
2. Training for teachers to support the development of numeracy across the curriculum.
3. Revised KS3 and KS4 curriculum to enable students to develop the skills that they will need in the new GCSE course.
4. Additional maths lesson in Year 7, Year 10 and Year 11.
5. Year 7 numeracy lesson every week and a focus on number skills in lessons.
6. Numeracy focus as part of the PSE programme in Year 11 every Thursday morning.
7. Numeracy Skills Builder as part of key stage 3 maths lessons.
8. Maths / Numeracy Teaching Assistant to support in lessons and provide 1:1 and small group teaching.

Impact of the Numeracy Catch-up Strategy: July 2017

The impact of the strategy will be evaluated at the end of July by re-testing number skills. A student that has caught up will have a reached the expected score will be deemed to have caught up.
